## Presenting Jesus

They bring Jesus to the temple to be "presented to the Lord," for he is "the Anointed of the Lord." One way of responding to this event is to reflect on our own 'presentation of the Lord.'

How do we present Jesus Christ to others? Is the Jesus we present to others a convenient cover for a life of personal misbehaviour and social indifference, or is he "the king of glory" whose person and teachings should govern us individually and collectively? Do we present Jesus to others on such a pedestal that people can dismiss his example as unreasonable expectation, or is he "like his brothers in every way," one of us, a brother human whose love of justice and peace can and should be imitated? Is the Jesus we present to others an indictment of them, or is he God's "saving deed displayed for all the peoples to see," the Messiah who rescues us from our personal and social sinfulness?

Is the Jesus we present to others a support for our dealings with death, our wars, abortions, and death penalties, or is he "a lamb without blemish (offered) for the life of the world"? Is the Jesus we present others a special 'god' for the privileged, or is he "the light of all peoples," including people who are weak and outcast?.

God's Word, through whom all things were made, was himself made flesh and dwelt on man's earth. Thus he entered the world's history as a perfect man, taking that history up into himself and summarizing it. He himself revealed to us that 'God is love' (I John 4:8) and at the same time taught us that the new command of love was the basic law of human perfection and hence of the world's transformation. To those, therefore, who believe in divine love, he gives assurance that the way of love lies open to men and that the effort to establish a universal brotherhood is not a hopeless one.

Vatican II, *Constitution on the Church in the Modern World*,

who had been held in slavery all their lives by the fear of death. For it was not the angels that he took to himself; he took to himself descent from Abraham. It was essential that he should in this way become completely like his brothers so that he could be a compassionate and trustworthy high priest of God's religion, able to atone for human sins. ## GOSPEL (Shorter Form)

The Lord be with you. **And with your spirit.** (Lk 2:22-40)

**✠** A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

When the day came for them to be purified as laid down by the Law of Moses, the parents of Jesus took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord – observing what stands written in the Law of the Lord: Every first-born male must be consecrated to the Lord and also to offer in sacrifice, in accordance with what is said in the Law of the Lord, a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons. Now in Jerusalem there was a man named Simeon. He was an upright and devout man; he looked forward to Israel's comforting and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death until he had set eyes on the Christ of the Lord. Prompted by the Spirit he came to the Temple and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the Law required, he took him into his arms and blessed God; and he said:

'Now, Master, you can let your servant go in peace, just as you promised; because my eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared for all the nations to see, a light to enlighten the pagans and the glory of your people Israel.'

## THE BLESSING OF CANDLES AND THE PROCESSION

### Antiphon

Behold, our Lord will come with power, to enlighten the eyes of his servants, alleluia.

*The Priest greets the people and blesses the candles, saying:*

Let us pray.

O God, source and origin of all light, who on this day showed to the just man Simeon the Light for revelation to the Gentiles, we humbly ask that, in answer to your people's prayers, you may be pleased to sanctify with your blessing **✠** these candles, which we are eager to carry in praise of your name, so that, treading the path of virtue, we may reach that light which never fails.

Through Christ our Lord.

*The Priest sprinkles the candles with holy water. He takes the lighted candle prepared for him and the procession begins with the acclamation:*

**Let us go in peace to meet the Lord.**

In the name of Christ.

Amen.

*All carry lighted candles. As the procession moves forward, the following Antiphon or another appropriate chant is sung.*

### Antiphon

*(Lk 2:29-32)*

A light for revelation to the Gentiles and the glory of your people Israel.  
Lord, now you let your servant go in peace, in accordance with your word. (Ant.)  
For my eyes have seen your salvation. (Ant.)  
Which you have prepared in the sight of all peoples. (Ant.)

*As the procession enters the church, the Entrance Antiphon of the Mass is sung: The Gloria in excelsis (Glory to God in the highest) is said or sung and the Mass continues in the usual manner.*

## THE INTRODUCTORY RITES

### Entrance Antiphon

*(Cf. Ps 47:10-11)*

Your merciful love, O God, we have received in the midst of your temple. Your praise, O God, like your name, reaches the ends of the earth; your right hand is filled with saving justice.

### Gloria

Glory to God in the highest, / and on earth peace to people of good will. / We praise you, / we bless you, / we adore you, / we glorify you, / we give you thanks for your great glory, / Lord God,

heavenly King, / O God, almighty Father. / Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, / Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, / you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; / you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; / you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. / For you alone are the Holy One, / you alone are the Lord, / you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, / with the Holy Spirit, / in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

*(Mt 3:1-4)*

A reading from the prophet Malachi.

The Lord God says this: Look, I am going to send my messenger to prepare a way before me. Who will be able to resist the day of his coming? Who will remain standing when he appears? For he is like the refiner's fire and the fullers' alkali. He will take his seat as refiner and purifier; he will purify the sons of Levi and refine them like gold and silver, and then they will make the offering to the Lord as it should be made.
